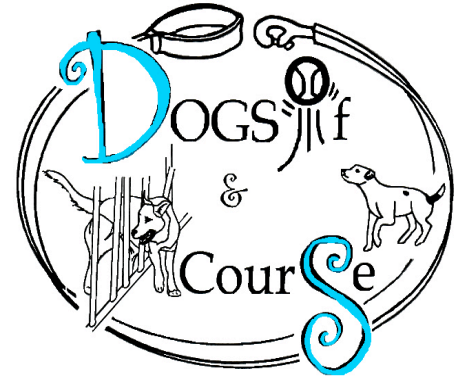

Trial Site & Concession

There will be no concession on site. Please bring your own drinks and snacks for yourself and your dog. The trial site is on open prairie please bring something to provide shade for yourself and your dogs.

**** ATTENTION ****

All dogs must be registered with AAC to compete in an AAC sanctioned trial. If your dog does not yet have an AAC ID card, fill out the registration form found on the AAC website and mail it to AAC. You must have an ID number to compete.

Move-ups:

Move ups from previous trials must be reported to trial secretary at least one week prior to trial start date.

Prizes and Awards:

Ribbons for placements 1st through 5th.
Ribbons and prizes for Qualifying Rounds.

Class Descriptions:

Regular Classes:

These classes are open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC Rules.

Specials Class:

These classes are open to all dogs but are intended for dogs that are of a size or stature that limits their jumping ability. A dog may no longer compete in Regular classes after being entered at an official AAC trial in any Specials class, except that they may move to Veterans.

Veterans Class:

These classes shall be for dogs seven years of age or older that are currently competing in any Regular Agility class and for dogs five years or older who have competed in the Specials Agility class for a minimum of one calendar year. Under AAC rules Veteran dogs may drop up to two jump heights below their Regular height category.

Junior Handler: Juniors and dogs may compete without regard to their accomplishments in any other agility class. The junior may handle a different dog from one (1) trial to the next, but is permitted to run only one dog per junior handler class. The dog may or may not be owned by the handler. Any dog entered in a junior class may compete in regular classes at the same AAC trial provided it does so with a different handler. A handler entered in a junior class may not compete in regular classes (including games) at the same AAC trial, but may compete in regular (i.e. non junior) classes at a different AAC trial. It is the handler's option as to whether the dog runs at its regulation height or one (1) jump height lower for the junior handler class. This

also applies to dogs who run/would run in Special and Veteran divisions, who would already be required to jump one (1) or two (2) jump heights lower than in regular class. These dogs may drop one (1) further jump height from their normal Special or Veteran jump height.

Height Categories and Jump Heights

If height at withers is:	12" and under	Over 12" to under 16"	Over 16" to under 21"	Over 21"
Regular	10"	16"	22"	26"
Specials	6"	10"	16"	22"
Veterans	6"	6" or 10"	10" or 16"	16" or 22"
